

## From the Office of Clinical Informatics Medication Manager Small Volume Insulin Dose May 10, 2022

Medication volume orders are rounded to the hundredth place. As a result, small doses of insulin do not reflect actual volumes. This flyer describes the process in which a pharmacist, at the time of order verification, can prevent the small dose of insulin rounding to the hundredth place. Following this process will display a more accurate volume on labels and to nursing staff.

## **Order Entry and Pharmacist Verification**

**STEP 1:** Provider enters order.

<u>STEP 2</u>: Order routes to **Medication Manager** for verification.

• The order sentence rounded up upon order entry.

STEP 3: To avoid the order from rounding, click Modify in the Verify Med Order window.

Change dose, for example: from 2.5
 Units / 0.03 mL to 2.5 Unit(s) / 0.025
 mL.





## STEP 4: Click Update.

- This will create a free text dose as the dose entered by the provider is being modified.
- Quantity per dose: can be entered as 1 EA.
