


Behavioral Health Providers across the service line will have the ability to add DSM-5 (psychiatric) diagnosis and problems in addition to ICD-10 (medical) diagnosis and problems. Please follow the below workflow to document a DSM-5 diagnosis or problem or an ICD-10 diagnosis or problem.

Problem List

If a patient has an existing ICD-10 chronic problem on their problem list, there are two options that can be followed to ensure that the proper DSM-5 language is associated for the diagnosis for the current visit and also be available as a Chronic problem on the patients problem list for their care team(s).

➤ **Option 1: Adding a new DSM-5 (Psychiatric) diagnosis**

- Search the proper DSM-5 language, with the specifiers, within the search field of the Problem List.
 - As a reminder, Providers can use the first few letters for each specifier to populate the specific diagnosis
- Select the diagnosis appropriate for the patient.
 - If other problems and diagnosis are on the problem list that are duplicate, please resolve so that the proper diagnosis and problem are reflected.

➤ **Option 2: Selecting a previously entered problem from the problem list**

If a diagnosis was entered on the patient's chronic problem list prior to 10/12/20 by a Behavioral Health Provider or entered at any time by a non-Behavioral Health provider, the convert window will display when This Visit is selected.

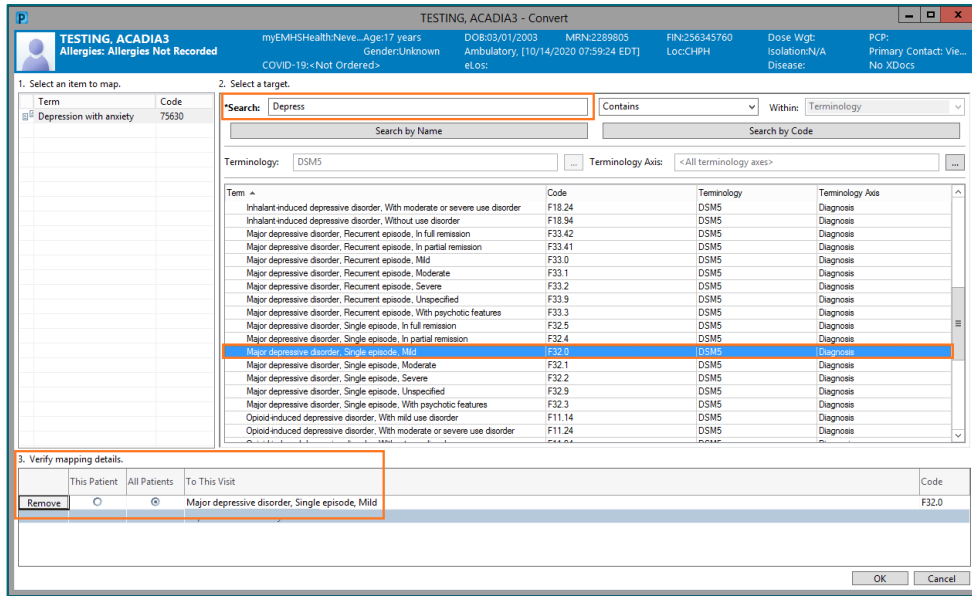
- The tool recognizes DSM-5 language and does not recognize the previous ICD-10 (medical and psychiatric) language. Use the convert window to search the appropriate DSM-5 language to convert from ICD-10 to DSM-5 language using the steps below.

STEP 1: Within the **Convert** (see visual below step 3) window, use the search field (Step 2) to enter the DSM-5 language

STEP 2: Select the appropriate DSM-5 diagnosis for the patient within the list and double click on it.

STEP 3: Review the mapping details within step 3 for the diagnosis.

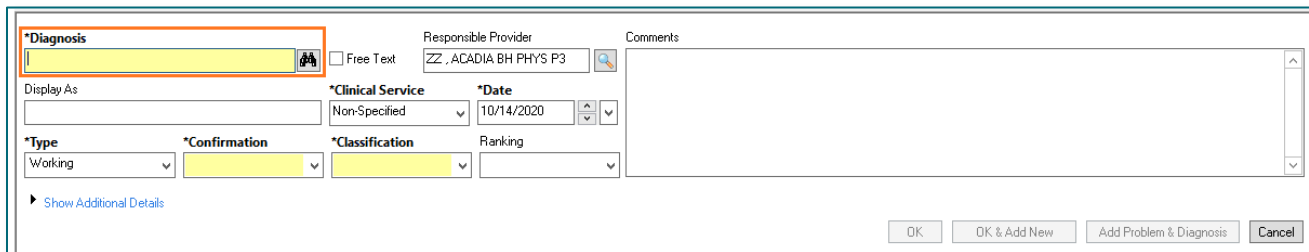
- If mapping was associated incorrectly, utilize the **Remove** option to remove the mapping previously associated.



➤ **Behavioral Health Providers Adding IDC-10 (Medical) diagnosis and problems**

All medical problems are entered using ICD-10 (medical) language. These diagnosis and problem(s) need to be added to the patient’s problem list using the steps below.

- STEP 1:** Select the **Problem List** component header to take you to the Diagnosis & Problem tool
- STEP 2:** Select the **Add** button and search for the ICD-10 (medical) diagnosis or problem within the search field and select the binoculars.
- STEP 3:** Utilize the **Diagnosis Search** window to search and select the appropriate diagnosis or problem and select **OK**.



- STEP 4:** Complete the required necessary information regarding the diagnosis and problem within the tool and select **OK**.
- STEP 5:** Select the back arrow or home icon to return to the workflow MPage.
