Cerner Millennium Skipping and Renaming Cycles


When entering regimen orders for pre-loading and the patient is on a cycle other than the first cycle, follow the steps outlined in this flyer to skip and rename the cycles to accurately reflect the cycle the patient is on.

Pre-Loading Regimens

- Skipping Cycles
 - When entering regimen orders for pre-loading, click the **Skip** button **Skip** to skip to the correct cycle number the patient is on.
 - Update the **Start Date** and **Time** to reflect the cycle start date.
- Skipping Cycles for Patients with Very High Cycle Numbers

For patients with very high cycle numbers, follow the steps below to skip and rename cycles.

- Skip all the cycles until the last cycle by clicking the Skip button. Skip
- Click the **Start** button **Start** on the last cycle.
- Update the cycle number to the actual cycle number the patient is on (e.g., cycle 10).
- Enter orders for the cycle.
 - When finished, click Orders for Signature, and then Sign.


