

Prescription Drug Monitoring Program (PDMP) Update Northern Light Mayo Hospital

On **Monday, March 18**, the **Opioid Review component** will be integrated within CommunityWorks for all **ambulatory** and **inpatient providers** at **Northern Light Mayo Hospital**. The Opioid Review **increases efficiency** by allowing providers to review opioid reports with the ability to automatically select the **PDMP review box**.

Opioid Review Component

- The **Opioid Review** component allows providers to review acute and prescribed opioid medications.
- Providers will need to click **Mark as Reviewed** once the PDMP information has been evaluated within the Opioid Review component.
