

Test Not Performed (TNP) Result

It was recently discovered that **Test Not Performed (TNP)** results from Quest are satisfying recommendations. Due to TNP being a valid result for Quest labs functioning as a satisfier, there is no way to ignore this specific value or remove from the interface. **For this reason, when a provider reviews lab results and sees TNP, the test will need to be re-ordered and patient contacted about re-draw.** The new results will re-satisfy recommendations and adjust the next due date accordingly.

Few Examples of TNP Result Comments

- No sample received
- Sample received but not in time
- Wrong tube color
- Sample amount not enough
- Specimen not labeled
